Constructed ca. 1866 by Thomas R. Carksadon, the home is a combination of Italianate and French Second Empire styles.

The Historical Foundation acquired the home in 2000. One year after its acquirement, the home suffered a fire that destroyed all the original flooring in the first floor.

Since that time volunteers have been working diligently to bring the home back to its original splendor including a working kitchen, two bathrooms, dining room, parlor room, family room, grand staircase, and eight upstairs bedrooms.

This three story (8 bedroom) home features iconic architecture unique to the era in which it was built, including wide center halls, grand fire places in almost every room, and a long staircase that any bride would love to descend on her wedding day.

The exterior property boarders the New Creek Mountain and the New Creek in the southeast of the property, making the home ideal for a family portait or outdoor event space!

It is the hope of the Foundation to open the home for tea parties and event rentals in the Summer of 2021.

The home is currently open to private scheduled tours.
