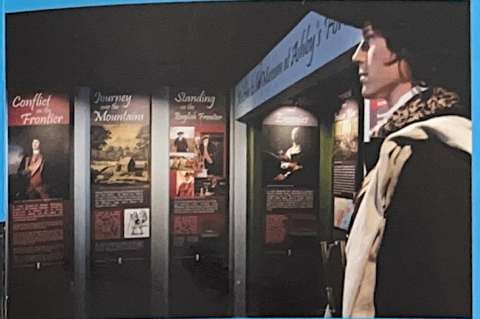
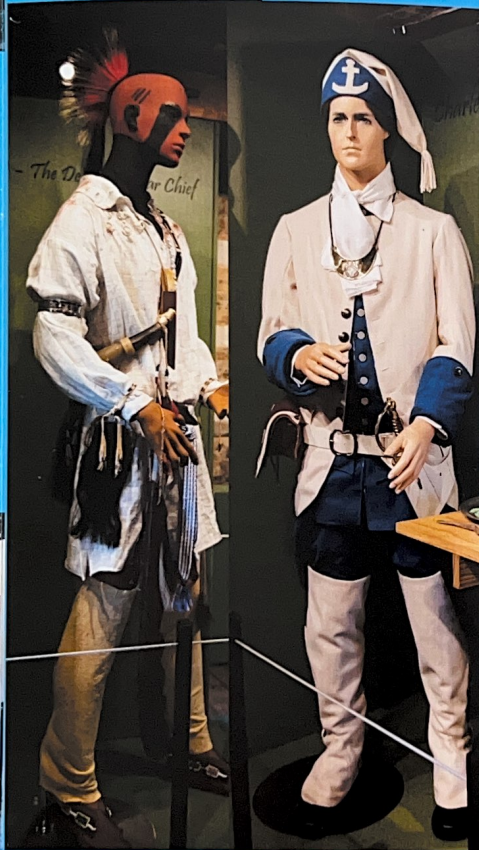


Find out about Washington's letter that scolds Captain Ashby for his wife Jane who sold rum to the men, and who was "chief of every mutiny".
